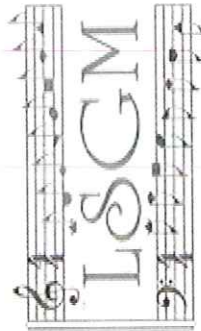

DIRECTIONS:

From the intersection of Hwy. 64 and Hwy. 43 in downtown Lawrenceburg, go west on Hwy. 64 approximately 1 1/2 miles. Turn left onto West Point Road and go 0.6 miles. Then take a right onto Granddaddy Road (CR-934) and drive 4.4 miles. Turn left on Mt. Lebanon Road and go 1 1/2 miles until you see Bradley Road on your right. Turn right onto Bradley Road for approximately a half mile until you see the camp entrance on your left. Watch for the signs pointing the way to LSGM.

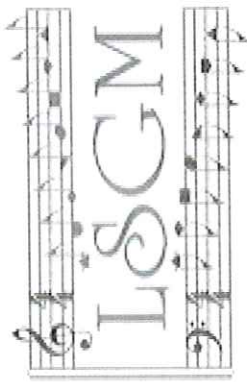

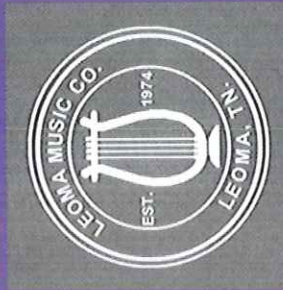

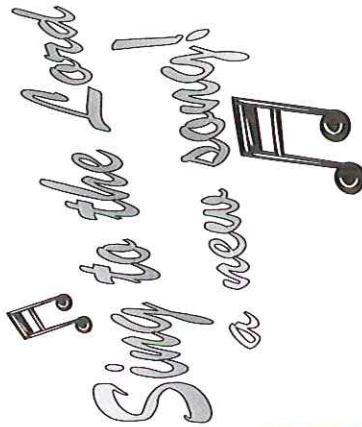

ABOUT LSGM

Leoma School of Gospel Music (LSGM) offers quality instruction in music fundamentals using the traditional shaped-note system of notation in convention-style southern gospel music. Our experienced and qualified instructors are devoted to meeting students' individual needs so that each student may find success. For those who are unsure of their skill level, we offer a diagnostic evaluation upon registration to determine the class placement that will best fit each person's level of achievement and age group. At LSGM, we strive to promote and enhance personal holiness, musicianship, confidence, and creativity.

Students under eight (8) years of age must be accompanied by a parent or guardian. Older children may attend without parental supervision but must acknowledge and abide by LSGM's code of conduct.



ASSEMBLIES

Each day of LSGM's session will begin with a devotional message. God's Word is the foundation of Gospel Music, and we strive to make it the foundation of our daily lives. Additional assemblies will be held throughout the day for group instruction, practice, and fellowship.

SPECIAL TOPICAL SEMINARS

Various topical seminars are tentatively scheduled at different times throughout the week. Possible topics include "Directing Music in Churches" and "Songwriting." Enrollment is free for full-time students. Others wishing to attend will be charged a nominal fee to offset expenses.

DRESS CODE

For most of the week's activities, we suggest clothing that is modest, casual, and cool. Regular-length and long shorts and pants are acceptable, but short shorts are prohibited. Also unacceptable are shorts or pants with words printed on them. Shorts and blouses with print are acceptable if the print is Christian in nature or is clearly inoffensive. Halter tops and tank tops are not allowed. Caps or hats are prohibited during class, private lessons, or anywhere indoors. You should bring swimwear if you intend to swim on the day we go to the pool. Again, modesty is a consideration.

For the closing program, we recommend semi-formal clothing or else what one would wear to church. Our final singing is, for us, a service of worship in song, and we want to bring God our best in our efforts, our attitudes, and our dress when we come into His house for worship.

CODE OF CONDUCT

Leoma School of Gospel Music is a non-denominational Christian organization with a professional staff and faculty of Christian people who work under the guidance of God's Word. We expect all students and visitors to act and behave in a Christian manner. Anyone acting outside of the guidelines set forth in our written "Code of Conduct" is subject to dismissal.

REGISTRATION
